NOTES FROM THE LOFT 4th Sunday of Lent

Most of us are familiar with the musical genre known as ‘Negro spirituals’, music which grew out of the shared faith experiences and ‘socio-political’ protests of transplanted and enslaved African peoples. What many of us do not know is that there is also a body of ‘white spirituals’, or ‘folk music’. These songs of faith developed from popular ballads. A fine example of this is “WHAT WONDROUS LOVE IS THIS”.

The term ‘folk music’ was popularized during the 1960s; however, in a prior century, it had a more precise meaning. ‘Folk music’ had defining characteristics: 1. It was created and transmitted orally by the illiterate working class which had neither the education nor the technology to put it in writing. 2. It built cohesiveness and preserved cultural identity. 3. It was sung to mark special events: a birthday, a wedding, a death, a feast, e.g. Christmas or Easter. 4. Its melodies were often of uncertain- even anonymous- origins and handed on generation after generation.

WHAT WONDROUS LOVE IS THIS can be described as a ‘white spiritual’. It has Appalachian roots with words attributed to Alexander Means, a 19th century Methodist clergyman, scientist, physician and teacher, who was inspired by John 3:16 (4th Sunday’s Gospel verse). Most sources agree the melody to which it was set, and printed for the first time by William Walker in his hymnal, “The Southern Harmony”, is actually the “Ballad of Captain Kidd” (1701), the same tune actually predating the ballad by about 100 years.

One musicologist describes “WHAT WONDROUS LOVE IS THIS” as “haunting”, even “plaintive”. Aside from its somber lyrics, this is largely due to the fact that it is based on what is known in music, as the ‘Dorian’ mode or scale. Using a keyboard, the easiest way to hear this is to begin on the white key “D” and play **only** the white keys for an octave, that is, up to and including the next “D”.

The ancient Greeks ascribed moral and ethical qualities to the ‘modes’. According to Plato, the Dorian was a mode capable of expressing sincerity. His student, Aristotle, took it even further, ascribing to it the power to inspire courage, action, moderation and religious purification. Next Sunday, Choir Mass music will include “WHAT WONDROUS LOVE IS THIS” # 483.
