**NOTES FROM THE LOFT**  
 July: Month of the Precious Blood

Each month of the Church year is dedicated to a particular aspect of our Catholic Faith. June focuses on the Sacred Heart. With the feast of Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the "Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ" still fresh in our memories, we designate JULY to honor the MOST PRECIOUS BLOOD.

Having been approved by (now) Pope St. John XXIII in 1960, the LITANY OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD is one of six 'indulgence' litanies formally established after Vatican II. An indulgence can remove part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin (i.e. lessen one's need for purification in Purgatory), depending upon the disposition of the soul (purity, intention, faith) of the person seeking to obtain the indulgence. Indulgences can be gained for oneself or for a deceased soul. (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1471).

The invocations of this Litany are beautiful and powerful, e.g. "Blood of Christ, WITHOUT WHICH there is no forgiveness...Blood of Christ, Eucharistic drink and refreshment of souls...Blood of Christ, bringing forth virgins...Blood of Christ, consolation of the dying..."

The Latin text of ADORO TE DEVOTE (Godhead Here in Hiding # 413) was composed by St. Thomas Aquinas (c.1264 AD) and set to Gregorian chant mode 5. Gerard Manley Hopkins, SJ's translation of verse six gives us a timely meditation:

"Like what tender tales tell of the Pelican, bathe me, Jesus Lord, in what Thy bosom ran – BLOOD- that but one drop of, has the pow'r to win all the world forgiveness of its world of sin...A pitying pelican, a caring pelican, dear Jesus, be!" One pre-Christian pelican legend describes how the mother bird in times of famine, tears at her very breast to feed her young lest they starve! Another describes how the young pelicans, arrogantly striking their parents, are struck and killed by them, only to be revived three days later by the mother, who "opens her side and pours blood over her dead young" reviving and healing them, but losing her life in the process. (Our Tabernacle bears a pelican motif on its door.)

Communion music today includes # 413. Verse Six sings of the Divine Pelican. Verse seven echoes the Entrance Antiphon, "I shall behold Your Face...the vision of Your glory."

After the liturgical reform of the Second Vatican council, the list of Saints celebrated by the entire church was purified. Because there are many stories about St. Christopher that have not been verified historically, St Christopher, though still celebrated as a Saint, is no longer celebrated on the universal church calendar. However, in honor of his being the patron saint of travelers (patronal feast, July 25), we will have the blessing of cars after the 10:00am on Sunday, July 26, 2015. As each car exits the parking lot, priests will be available to bless each of our cars and sprinkle them with holy water.
