**NOTES FROM THE LOFT**

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
February 5, 2017

A recent conversation with a young church musician proved to be a genuine “teachable moment.” Our discussion centered on the successes and shortcomings parishes experience in “marrying” the Mass to the music.

This is the fundamental challenge the liturgical musician faces on a weekly basis. Music for the Sacrifice of the Mass must be sacred. Musical selections must complement – not distract nor detract from – the holy action at the altar. A balance must be struck between beauty and function, performance and prayer. Music for congregations must be inspiring but not difficult, regular but not routine. It can be soaring and intellectual, but it must also touch the heart.

The Church provides two principles. First, musical choices must be guided by the liturgical readings: How are they thematically connected? How do we sing what the Word is speaking?

Secondly, the music must be suited to the liturgical action – e.g., appropriate for an entrance procession or conducive to a Communion meditation. This, however, is just the beginning for the musical director when planning a well-integrated spoken-and-sung liturgy.

The serious liturgical musician is a person of prayer. Meditation on the Sunday selections from the Old and New Testaments is essential. Scripture is the voice of God: What is He saying to us here and now?

Familiarity with the daily Mass readings and praying the Divine Office during the week provide an even broader understanding. A prayerful approach to the sacred texts, plus familiarity with a range of music from chant to traditional hymns to contemporary compositions, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, can create something mystical out of what can, sadly, at times become mundane.

Liturgy and sacred music can be a catechetical vehicle to teach the truths of the Catholic faith. Authentic lyrics reinforce the meaning of its mysteries. The vocation of the composer is to put his or her talents at the service of what is eternally Good, True and Beautiful!

This is movingly demonstrated in the modern composition ANIMA CHRISTI by Msgr. Marco Frisina, director of Orchestra and Chorus for the Diocese of Rome. The Latin lyrics, taken from a 14<sup>th</sup> Century prayer, include these powerful invocations: “*Soul of Christ, sanctify me! Body of Christ, save me! Blood of Christ, inebriate me! Water from the side of Christ, wash me!*”

It will be sung at the Choir Mass on February 5.

**RESPECT LIFE**

**A Continuing Prod to the Conscience.**



President Ronald Reagan, in his book *Abortion and the Conscience of the Nation* (1983) wrote: "Make no mistake, abortion-on-demand is not a right granted by the Constitution. No serious scholar, including one disposed to agree with the Court's result, has argued that the framers of the Constitution intended to create such a right. Shortly after the Roe v. Wade decision, Professor John Hart Ely, now Dean of Stanford Law School, wrote that the opinion 'is not constitutional law and gives almost no sense of an obligation to try to be.' Nowhere do the plain words of the Constitution even hint at a 'right' so sweeping as to permit abortion up to the time the child is ready to be born. Yet that is what the Court ruled. As an act of 'raw judicial power' (to use Justice White's biting phrase), the decision by the seven-man majority in Roe v. Wade has so far been made to stick. But the Court's decision has by no means settled the debate. Instead, Roe v. Wade has become a continuing prod to the conscience of the nation."

## BEHIND THE SCENES AT ASSUMPTION

It takes many people to see to it that a parish runs smoothly. In our continuing series highlighting parish employees and volunteers, we focus this week on Donna Sticco, Choir Director and Cantor at Assumption.



*"Hello, my name is Donna Marie Sticco, and I have the best job: I sing for God!"*

*Before becoming Choir Director and Cantor at Assumption in 2009, I enjoyed 30 years conducting an 'a cappella' schola, which brought chant and polyphony to churches in the New York metropolitan area. I am honored to have been recently appointed to the Archdiocesan Commission for Liturgical Music.*

*Upon graduating from Seton Hall University, I launched a 34-year career in public elementary education. By 1978 I had also completed studies at a pontifical institute at St. John's University, earning an MA in Catholic Doctrine and a catechetical diploma from the Vatican. (I also continued my studies at St. Joseph's Seminary.)*

*Simultaneous with public school teaching, I worked for 23 years as Director of Religious Education at the Church of Mary's Nativity in Flushing, Queens, while devoting summers to training catechists on parish and graduate levels in Oregon, Wyoming and Virginia.*

*Changing careers in 2004, I spent the next five years teaching high school theology, literature, and music and art appreciation.*

*Writing "Notes from the Loft" for each week's bulletin and teaching RCIA for Teens provide me with intellectual stimulation. My greatest joy, however is assisting our priests in the care of souls by monitoring the weekly visits of our Extraordinary Ministers, who have touched the lives of some 300 people at last count, 103 of whom have gone home to the Lord!"*

## FAMED PREACHER COMING TO ASSUMPTION



Assumption is pleased to announce that Saulo Hidalgo – renowned lay Catholic preacher and minister of healing – will be coming to our Church in mid-February for a Healing Mass and a Pre-Lenten Retreat. Mr. Hidalgo, born in the Dominican Republic and residing in Texas, will preach at both the Healing Mass and during the day of retreat.

**Saturday, February 11:** The Pre-Lenten Retreat will begin at 8:30 am with recitation of the Rosary and a Mass at 9:00 am; a light breakfast will be served, followed by a day of talks by Mr. Hidalgo.
