RESPECT LIFE



Divine Mercy and Pro-Life. Saint John Paul II, as Pope, declared the Sunday after Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday. Many of the faithful pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy regularly. There is a link between this devotion and the pro-life movement. In his article “Wombs of Mercy,” Father Seraphim Michalenko, MIC, a principal translator of Saint Faustina’s diary and the postulator of her cause of canonization, writes: *“On at least three occasions, from 8:00 – 11:00 in the evening, she felt like her insides were being torn apart. She suffered so much that she thought she was going to die. The doctors couldn’t figure out what was ailing her, and no medication was able to alleviate her sufferings. Later, she was given to understand that she was undergoing those pains for mothers who were aborting their children... On another occasion, she had a vision of an angel coming with thunderbolts to destroy one of the most beautiful cities of her country. And she felt powerless to do anything about it... [the] city was to be chastised for its sins, primarily the sin of abortion... What antidote did the Lord give her? The Chaplet of Divine Mercy.”*

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY AND HOLY HOUR

During the course of Jesus’ revelations to Saint Faustina, He asked that a feast day be dedicated to the Divine Mercy and that this feast be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter (i.e., the Octave Day of Easter). Pope John Paul II made clear that the image of the Divine Mercy seen by Saint Faustina – representing the Risen Christ bringing mercy to the world – should be venerated on Divine Mercy Sunday. In his homily at her canonization Mass, the Pope described the now iconic image as “two rays of light shining from that Heart and illuminating the world: ‘The two rays,’ Jesus Himself explained to [Saint Faustina] one day, ‘represent blood and water.’”

Most every Sunday afternoon of the year, our parish has a Divine Mercy Holy Hour. As this **Sunday (April 23)** is the actual Divine Mercy Sunday, Assumption will host a special bilingual celebration in the Church at 3:00 pm, with an opportunity for Confession and the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. As an added enticement, refreshments will follow.

BEHIND THE SCENES AT ASSUMPTION

It takes many people to see to it that a parish runs smoothly. In our continuing series highlighting parish employees and volunteers, we focus this week on Mary Mancini Tacca, Coordinator of Music at Assumption.



"Hello! My name is Mary Mancini Tacca. I was born in Peekskill, attended Assumption School (K-8) and have been a parishioner of Assumption Church all my life.

Along with the Franciscan Sisters and Assumption Priests, my parents set the best example for me by their devotion to God, their constant faith and teaching the importance of attending Church on a regular basis.

My desire to be part of the Assumption "family" began during those early school years – I helped out in the sacristy every Friday, cleaning candle holders and doing whatever else was needed.

Eventually, I was elected President of the Sodality of Mary and was asked to join the choir at age 11. This allowed me to be part of all the musical shows that took place on the stage of what is now Father Wilson Hall. I knew early on that God had blessed me with the gift of music!

When I "grew up," I went to work in the legal department of IBM at its T.J. Watson Research Center. At the same time, I began studying vocal music and eight languages under private tutelage in New York City, studies which spanned over 20 years!

After about ten years of studies, realizing the strength of my gift, I took the leap and devoted myself to music full-time. My concert and show work is ongoing; I've performed throughout the USA, Canada, Europe and even twice in the People's Republic of China.

As Coordinator of Music at Assumption, cantoring two Masses every weekend and singing for funerals and weddings, I continue expanding my music repertoire – and I love every minute of it!

In addition to my music ministry, I've been the chairperson of Assumption's Events Committee for 25 years. I truly enjoy both putting on events in the parish and working with fellow parishioners on the committee. (And we're always looking for volunteers!)

I am doubly blessed to be able to work with my husband, Mario Tacca, who not only is an organist at Assumption but is also a world champion accordionist. We've been making beautiful music together for 41 years, recording ten CDs during that time as well as producing three marvelous children and eight precious grandchildren!

I am so grateful to be part of Assumption and most grateful for God's plan over my life – He has given me the gift of music and I am driven to gift it back to Him."



NOTES FROM THE LOFT

Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)
April 23, 2017

In recent days the Church has presented us with long, descriptive narratives of Christ's Passion and Resurrection, narratives filled with the mention of many ordinary people "rising to the occasion" of showing mercy.

There is Pilate's wife, Claudia, who interceded on Jesus' behalf: *"While [Pilate] was sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent word to him, 'Have nothing to do with that righteous man, for I have suffered much over Him today in a dream'."* (Matthew 27:19) Also known as "Procula," she is revered as a saint by Orthodox Churches.

Though Veronica isn't mentioned in Scripture, she is nevertheless memorialized in the Sixth Station of the Cross, offering Jesus a small gesture of mercy by wiping the spittle and blood from His disfigured face with her veil.

Simon of Cyrene helped carry the Cross, but Luke's Gospel records he was "seized" (Luke 23:26), and the Gospels of both Matthew (27:32) and Mark (15:21) state he was "compelled" to assist lest Jesus die "prematurely." Perhaps after the Resurrection, Simon realized the magnitude of the mercy he had extended!

The women of Jerusalem and their children wept for Jesus – this young man who left no children of His own to mourn for him! – en route to Calvary.

Disciples Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea were also Pharisees and members of the Sanhedrin, who dissented from the decision to put Jesus to death. Joseph assumed responsibility for Jesus' burial, approaching Pilate for Jesus' body, providing the burial cloths and his own pre-arranged burial place; Nicodemus supplied about 75 pounds of aloes and myrrh. For touching a corpse, their gestures of mercy incurred ritual impurity upon them!

Mary Magdalene and her female companions returned to the tomb to complete the burial rites in a final gesture of mercy, only to become its heralds! That Easter evening, Jesus mysteriously appeared to the Twelve and gave them the ultimate mercy: the power to forgive sins.

YE SONS AND DAUGHTERS (#169) tells the story of the octave of Easter, which ends on Divine Mercy Sunday with Thomas' stunning profession of faith – *"My Lord and My God!"* The hymn's nine stanzas were originally composed in Latin ("O Filii et Filiae") by 15th Century Franciscan preacher Jean Tisserand; renowned English translations were made by both Fr. Edward Caswall, CO and Anglican clergyman John M. Neale.

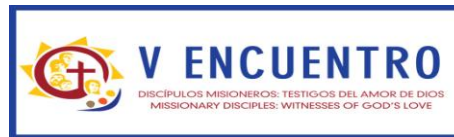
