**NOTES FROM THE LOFT**

**Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
July 30, 2017**

The Gospels for the last three Sundays of July develop a common theme: THE KINGDOM OF GOD. Matthew’s account abounds with metaphorical ‘kingdom parables’. It is compared to a sower casting seeds with abandon and a farmer who has his wheat crop sabotaged by an enemy sowing weeds. It is like a tiny mustard seed becoming a bush. Like yeast expanding. It is like a buried treasure or a pearl of great price which, once discovered, must be had at all cost. It’s like the head of a household with an impressive storeroom. On the other hand, Jesus says it is even like a fishnet open to ANYTHING in its path!

Jesus had a lot of preconceived notions to displace with His teaching on “the kingdom”. First century Jews were expecting a powerful entity and a commanding figure at the head of it. A military triumph! Political dominance! National supremacy! Jesus’ kingdom is a mystery – already among them. Its outreach is quiet and hidden, silent yet growing. On other occasions, He says it is childlike – and yet must be seized by force.

Next Sunday’s Responsorial Psalm shows us how to possess this kingdom: “I love Your commands...the law of Your mouth...(it) is my delight.” The word of God is more precious than gold or silver. IT is the pearl, the treasure! It enlightens the mind and “gives understanding to the simple.”

Jesus assured Pilate He truly was a king, but that His kingdom was “not of this world.” For that matter, neither Caiaphas nor Herod grasped that its geography is the human heart which surrenders to His rule and its citizens the merciful and clean of heart!

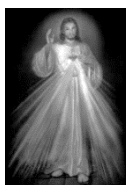
### RCIA CLASSES BEGINNING SOON

## EVERY MEMBER IS A MINISTER: THE GROUPS OF ASSUMPTION SERIES

*Assumption is blessed by many groups, devotions and ministries. This week we focus on the EMHC:*

"Let those who are to be installed as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion for the Church of the Assumption come forward as their names are called." So, begins the Rite of Commissioning for those who have discerned and prepared through study, prayer and practice to accept the awesome responsibility of assisting the priest, the Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion, in bringing the Lord to His People.



The priest continues, "Are you prepared to serve in the Sacred Liturgy with reverence, devotion, commitment and dedication? To give witness to the Lord, not only with your voice, but also with the example of your life? To distribute Holy Communion to the faithful who anxiously await to receive it, and to defend the Blessed Sacrament even with your life?" Each answer: "I am".

On the Solemnity of Christ, the King, November 2012, Fathers Higgins and Vincent substantially increased the number of English-speaking EMHCs. There are currently twenty-seven active ministers. Three of them also completed the volunteer training program at NYP/HVH. The Spanish community has eight active ministers and a dozen in training. Most members of the Legion of Mary are EMHCs.

The proper name for the non-ordained person who assists the priest in the distribution of Communion is "EXTRAORDINARY Minister of Holy Communion". Following the guidelines of Canon Law and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, EMHCs trained here at Assumption study the Church's teachings on the Eucharist from the CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH as well as other church documents. They learn how to comport themselves for the distribution of Communion at Mass as well as Communion Services and visits for the sick and institutionalized. They are trained in the special care given to the purification of vessels that hold the Eucharist and the proper laundering of the linens associated with their ministry. Formal and informal training is ongoing.

At the core of the EMHC's apostolate is a Eucharistic spirituality – regular, even daily Mass and reception of Holy Communion, Adoration, frequent confession, obedience to the Gospel and the pouring out of oneself in the spirit of sacrifice and 'thanksgiving' – for that is what the word 'eucharist' means. This spirituality must become the driving force and the goal of the EMHC worthy of the name.

EMHCs at Assumption function in a variety of ways. Most are called on for service at Mass. Many make house calls, sometimes for years to the same people.

The 'retirees' share the huge task of weekly visits to local nursing homes including Cortlandt Healthcare, North Westchester Restorative Therapy, Holy Comforter /Field Home, Emerald Peek and Skyview – wherever we have parishioners or patients our priests have met in the hospitals. Every Tuesday, a team of three EMHCs do room visits for Fr. Matthew Cherion at Bethel Nursing Home, Croton, while he says Mass. Every Thursday, a team of five EMHCs serve over twenty residents at Drumhill with a Communion Service and about twenty-five room visits. That ministry has exploded from a mere handful in 2014 to over seventy, twenty-two of whom have passed, well-prepared, into eternal life. Another EMHC single-handedly sees over twenty residents at CHC!

EMHCs are currently serving almost 200 people weekly! They are tracked from home to hospital to rehab and back again. The Lord has called 124 homes. Another 80+ have resumed normal living. The combined service of English and Spanish EMHCs since the expansion of the ministry in 2012 has reached over 400 people – ALL of whom were seen for the sacraments of Penance and Anointing by our diligent priests!! 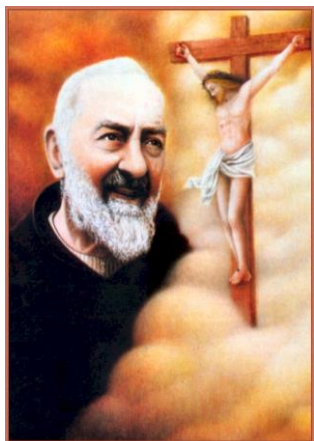

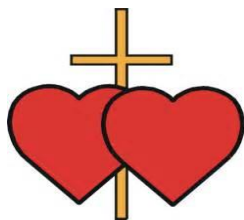
