NOTES FROM THE LOFT

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

July 5, 2015

For a church music director ORDINARY TIME can be likened to a 'liturgical summer'. It ushers in a period of 'normalcy' after the musical demands of Holy Week and the high -and prolonged- celebration of the fifty-day Easter season. The First Communion and Confirmation Masses have accomplished their work of Christian initiation. The Lord has ascended; Pentecost has passed. Corpus Christi is a beautiful memory of candles and flowers, music and processions.

The Liturgy of the Word retells the familiar story of the evangelizing work of the Apostles and the journeys of St. Paul. Once again we listen to the Epistles – the Letters to the newly-founded churches. Congregations grow a little leaner in the summer as families depart for vacations, but the Sacrifice of the Mass continues to be offered, nonetheless. Music directors tend to fall back on simpler settings as Choirs, too, thin out in July and August. Some choirs break for the summer (but not here at Assumption!) It's actually a good time to try a little something new when the pressure is off.

I recently re-read an address presented June 22, 2010 by Msgr. Andrew Wadsworth, CO, Executive Director of ICEL (International Commission on English in the Liturgy). He wrote: "If we look at the <u>General Instruction of the Roman Missal</u> (2010 Rome), we get an idea about the function of music in our liturgical celebration...of its purpose. MUSIC IS PART OF OUR PRAYER. It's part of what we do, the WORK which is 'liturgy'...a Greek word for 'the WORK of the People'."

The Assumption Adult Choir 'works' all summer long! And why not? As faithful Catholics, some members have sung in the loft for as long as forty years! Others, not quite forty months, but they love their 'work'! They love the Lord! They invite parishioners to come on up! Pick up a hymnal and get to 'work' – singing prayer! Settings of the Mass will be taken from our English chant repertoire: the MISSA SIMPLEX; the BELMONT MASS; the PSALLITE MASS; the MASS OF THE PATRIARCHS. Easy stuff!

Next Sunday we'll introduce the congregation to a new setting of "Taste and See" by Stephen Dean from Suffolk in the UK, editor and publisher of "Laudate", a leading British hymnal.



After the liturgical reform of the Second Vatican council, the list of Saints celebrated by the entire church was purified. Because there are many stories about St. Christopher that have not been verified historically, St Christopher, though still celebrated as a Saint, is no longer celebrated on the universal church calendar. However, in honor of his being the patron saint of travelers (patronal feast, July 25), we will have the blessing of cars after the 10:00am on Sunday, July 26, 2015. As each car exits the parking lot, priests will be available to bless each of our cars and sprinkle them with holy water.
