Jesus' Death is Our Example. The words of Saint John Paul II in his encyclical Evangelium Vitae ("The Gospel of Life") (n. 51): "Jesus, who upon entering into the world said 'I have come, O God, to do your will' (cf. Heb 10:9),

made himself obedient to the Father in everything and, 'having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end' (Jn 13:1), giving himself completely for them. He who had come 'not to be served but to serve. and to give his life as a ransom for many' (Mk 10:45). attains on the Cross the heights of love: 'Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends' (Jn 15:13). And he died for us while we were yet sinners (cf. Rom 5:8). In this way Jesus proclaims that life finds its center, its meaning and its fulfillment when it is given up. At this point our meditation becomes praise and thanksgiving and, at the same time, urges us to imitate Christ and follow in his footsteps (cf. 1 Pt 2:21). We, too, are called to give our lives for our brothers and sisters and thus to realize, in the fullness of truth, the meaning and destiny of our existence."

BEHIND THE SCENES AT ASSUMPTION

It takes many people to see to it that a parish runs smoothly. In our continuing series highlighting parish employees and volunteers, we focus this week on Christopher McGinnis, Church Organist at Assumption.



"My name is Christopher McGinnis, and I've been a parishioner of Assumption since I was a baby. Who would have guessed I would one day be its church organist? But, as fate would have it, four years ago, when I was 15, Donna Sticco [Assumption's Choir Director and Cantor] called and asked if I would be

interested in playing the organ for the Church, and the rest is history!

I started studying piano privately at Juilliard when I was seven years old. My father has been my mentor and teacher since the beginning. (In fact, his father – my grandfather Eddy McGinnis – was a professional drummer and had his own orchestra.) You might say musical aptitude runs in the McGinnis family.

I enjoy playing all styles of music – pop, jazz, Latin and classical. When I was 13, my exposure on YouTube gave me the opportunity to play my original pop music for thousands of young fans at concerts across the U.S.

I attended schools in the Hendrick Hudson School District and played sports. My top sport then was basketball; now it's skiing.

I currently attend Iona College and recently joined a large real estate firm in New York City.

But I plan to continue playing the organ at Assumption and singing at weekly Masses, funerals, weddings – and private parties! – for as long as I can. Life is exciting!"

NOTES FROM THE LOFT Music and Customs of Holy Week April 9-14, 2017

Holy Thursday (Maundy Thursday) begins the sacred Triduum (three days). From the Latin *mandatum* (commandment), "Maundy" refers to the commands Jesus gave the Twelve at the Last Supper:

"Do as I have done to you.

"Keep my commandments."

"Love one another as I have loved you."

"Take and eat; this is my body."

"Drink... for this is my blood of the covenant."

"Do this in remembrance of me."

For the first time in weeks, the "Gloria" is sung, accompanied on Holy Thursday by vigorous ringing of the bells, which will be supplanted until the Easter Vigil by use of the "crotalus" or wooden clapper (from the Greek *krotalon* – i.e., rattle). In ages past, parents told children that, during the "Gloria" of Holy Thursday, all the bells fly off to Rome to visit the Pope. They sleep on the roof of St. Peter's Basilica for the next few nights, preparing to fly back during the singing of the "Gloria" at the Easter Vigil – carrying Easter eggs with them!

The office of Tenebrae, dating back to the Seventh or Eighth Century AD, is characterized by the successive extinguishing of altar candles. Traditionally sung in monasteries in dark morning hours, Tenebrae is divided into three "nocturns" – comprised of a psalm, a lesson (reading) and a sung responsory.

Then comes the "Benedictus," or Canticle of Zechariah, proclaiming God has redeemed His People. Only the Christ candle remains lit and may be temporarily removed from the sanctuary. In a solemn Tenebrae, a very loud noise is created to symbolize the sealing of the tomb.

The Lamentations are the chief feature of Tenebrae. Ascribed to the prophet Jeremiah, they are five songs of lament. In Hebrew the text is called the "How" because it begins "How lonely sits the City..." Jerusalem fell in 587-586 BC, and its population was deported in waves of tens of thousands to Babylon, where the exiles remained until liberated in 539 BC.

The Lamentations, reflecting Jeremiah's personal mourning over the ruined City's failure to repent, take the form of an "elegy" – a profound, poetic expression of lament for the dead. In Lamentations 1, 2 and 4, each verse begins with a successive letter of the Hebrew alphabet (e.g., Aleph, Beth...)

Christ spoke of His own Body as a Temple. The Church "laments" His Passion – the destruction of the Body of His Temple – but also recalls His prophecy of resurrection.

The Lamentations will be sung in English at the 9:00 am Tenebrae services on Holy Thursday through Holy Saturday and in Latin at the 3:00 pm Good Friday service.
